## COCAINE AUCTION AUCTIONEER: PSAM FRANK TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN AUCTIONEER AND BIDDER

This is an agreement between Psam Frank ("the auctioneer" herein) and each bidder in the auction described herein.

The item up for auction is a bag of cocaine valued at \$100.

The auction item was previously brought into the Vancouver Police Department (VPD) headquarters for a <u>confession of possession</u> on June 20, 2021 to test whether the constitutional defence provided by the Canada Interactive Legislature (CIL) would be an effective means of providing people in Canada the ability to safely and responsibly use drugs otherwise prohibited by the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* (the "*Act*" herein), with the intention of assuring that people who use drugs have a more effective and reliable avenue to assure that the drugs they use are tested for toxins.

The auction item was then brought into the VPD headquarters again on December 31, 2021 to <u>confess to the intention to traffic</u>, including the sale of the auction item as well as the acquisition of further quantities of drugs for transacting with eligible users.

No intention to intervene in the auction was made known by the VPD. However, it was not confirmed that the constitutional arguments provided by the auctioneer were the reason for abstention from detainment or charges.

Bidders are advised to be conscientious of their right not to be arbitrarily detained or imprisoned as protected in <u>section 9</u> of the *Constitution Act, 1982*, part of "the supreme law of Canada" as given assent by Her Majesty Elizabeth II. If the auctioneer has confessed to possession of the auction item and provided a constitutional defence and has not been detained or imprisoned, then it may appear likely to qualify as arbitrary for the winning bidder to be detained or imprisoned for the same action, and with the same constitutional defence.

Bidders are advised to be familiar with the constitutional defence provided in Appendix A of the CIL *Charter*, starting on page 10. Bidders are also advised to be familiar with the *Charter of Commerce* for drugs and substances otherwise prohibited by Crown legislation.

Once a bid is cast, the auctioneer is legally bound by this agreement unless he proposes alterations to this agreement to a subsequent bidder and the bidder agrees before casting the next higher bid.

If a bid is cast and then no further bid is cast before 7PM BC time (deadline to be extended at auctioneer's discretion) on the termination date of bidding, June 20, 2022, then the auctioneer agrees to provide the auction item to the final bidder in exchange for the bidder satisfying the conditions of this agreement.

Casting a bid in this auction is an agreement to pay the amount bid to the auctioneer at the termination of bidding if no higher bid is subsequently made.

Casting a bid in this auction is an agreement to consider membership in the Interactive Sovereign Society, a condition of being subjected to the relevant laws enacted by the CIL instead of the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act*. The bidder must be a member before receiving the auction item.

Casting a bid in the auction is an agreement that, upon casting the highest bid, the bidder shall publicly affirm an affidavit, to an official such as a Notary Public, as prescribed in the *Charter of Commerce for drugs and substances otherwise prohibited by the Crown*, before receiving the auction item. Bidders are advised that affirming an affidavit if any of the facts presented in the affidavit are known to be untrue may make the bidder subject to penalties for perjury, which carries a <u>sentence</u> of up to 14 years imprisonment.

If the bidder is living under financial marginalisation then the auctioneer agrees to pay the cost of affirming the affidavit.

The bidder may be asked by the auctioneer whether to post the bidder's name publicly on the front page of the ISS website where the latest bid will be posted.

The bidder may be asked by the auctioneer whether contact information may be provided to the previous bidder to keep the tone of the bidding friendly and social.

Contact with other bidders shall be encouraged as an opportunity to discuss whether the ISS should provide any exemptions to its members from Covid restrictions, and if so, how much of an exemption should be provided. It is encouraged to note that more enfranchised voters are more likely to adhere to the measures that they collectively agree upon, so measures may be expected to be more effective and therefore lesser restrictions may achieve the same level of reduction in virus transmissibility.

The termination date of this auction was chosen in loving memorial of Charmaine Johnston, around the anniversary of her murder by a toxic substance, planted without her knowledge in a drug she was using.



## Constitution Act, 1982

3 Every citizen of Canada has the right to vote in an election of members of the House of Commons or of a legislative assembly and to be qualified for membership therein.

24 (1) Anyone whose rights or freedoms, as guaranteed by this Charter, have been infringed or denied may apply to a court of competent jurisdiction to obtain such remedy as the court considers appropriate and just in the circumstances.

1 The *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* guarantees the rights and freedoms set out in it subject only to such reasonable limits prescribed by law as can be demonstrably justified in a free and democratic society.

52 (1) The Constitution of Canada is the supreme law of Canada, and any law that is inconsistent with the provisions of the Constitution is, to the extent of the inconsistency, of no force or effect.
